RESEARCH



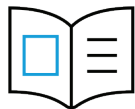
7-in-10 people engage in smartphone activities while driving.¹ Research drives the *It Can Wait* campaign and 60% of drivers say spreading the word and talking about distracted driving has an impact on how they behave behind the wheel.¹

ACTION



The *It Can Wait* pledge asks drivers to make a personal commitment to never drive distracted. Since 2010, the *It Can Wait* campaign has generated more than 40 million pledges to drive distraction free.

EDUCATION



The *It Can Wait* campaign shares tips to help drive distraction free; resources to speak up against distracted driving; and a community toolkit to help spread the word in local communities.

ADVOCACY



As part of *It Can Wait*, AT&T supports hands-free laws and bans on smartphone use while driving across the country.² Today, 48 states have implemented texting and driving laws.³
